

Noctilus Nexus – Short Biographies

Katalin

Katalin is a German contact experiencer and mother of two whose reported interactions with non-human intelligences span her entire life. Beginning in early childhood, her experiences have included recurring encounters, unusual states of consciousness, symbolic imagery, and phenomena that extend to experiences reported by her children.

Many of these experiences were documented years before they became the subject of systematic analysis. Katalin recounted her life story in the German-language book "Das Alien Projekt" (2024; *The Alien Project*) and produced numerous drawings depicting elements of her experiences. Her testimony and documentation form the experiential foundation of the *Noctilus Nexus* project.

Dr. Marcel Polte

Dr. Marcel Polte is a German attorney and independent researcher who has investigated reports of anomalous experiences and alleged non-human contact for more than a decade. He spent about fifteen years working as a corporate law specialist at international law firms.

In his research, he compared historical case material by German and US-researchers with the findings from his own field investigations with experiencers. As a certified hypnotherapist, he has also employed hypnotic regression as one of several research tools in selected cases. In 2018, he published "GREYS" in German, presenting the results of his research (published in English in 2022 under the title "Non-Human Contact"). Further books by Dr. Polte examine allegations regarding MKULTRA and ritual abuse in an intergenerational cult context.

The Collaboration

Katalin's and Dr. Polte's collaboration began several years before Katalin's first book was published. Over the course of this long-term exchange of information, Dr. Polte documented and analyzed Katalin's and her children's reports, drawings, and personal records, providing a unique opportunity to compare material recorded over many years with later developments that ultimately became part of the *Noctilus Nexus* investigation.
